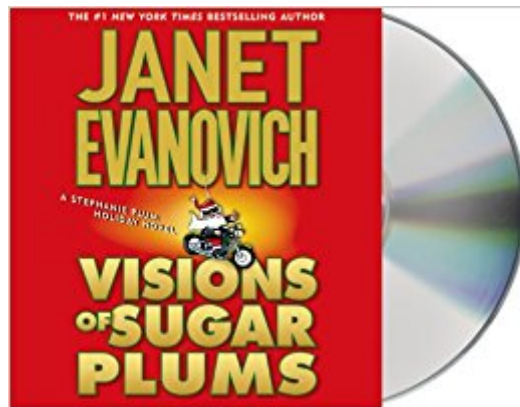




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Visions Of Sugar Plums: A Stephanie Plum Holiday Novel (Stephanie Plum Novels)

Christmas in bounty hunter Stephanie Plum's world isn't quite like Christmas in Whoville. With only four days to go before December 25, she doesn't have a decorated tree in her apartment or any

presents bought. Plus she's chasing an elusive bail-jumper named Sandy Claws; a hunky guy named Diesel is literally popping in and out of her apartment; and a mob of manic elves is threatening to assault her with cookies. The end result is that Stephanie is feeling a tad stressed over the holiday season. Life isn't any calmer over at her parents' home in the Burg, where Grandma Mazur is dating a new octogenarian stud muffin; sister Valerie is wailing over some unwelcome news; and Stephanie's mother is coping by belting back tumblers of Red Roses in the kitchen. Just where is the elusive Mr. Claws hiding, and why? What's causing the power blackouts all over Trenton? And what about the mysterious villain, Mr. Ring? Is all of this real, or is Stephanie just having a very bad dream? Janet Evanovich's mysteries are eagerly awaited by fans everywhere and this holiday installment won't disappoint. Fans of the Stephanie Plum series won't be disappointed with this wonderful adaptation of Evanovich's Christmas tale. Although it's somewhat less creative than some of her other novels, this is still an amusing tale. The story begins with the mysterious arrival of Diesel, a tall, handsome stranger who appears in bounty hunter Stephanie Plum's kitchen. He's caught Stephanie at a bad time: not only is she woefully behind on her Christmas shopping, but she hasn't been able to locate bail-jumper Sandy Claws. As usual, she's got family problems, too. Her sister is pregnant, her grandmother has a new boyfriend and her mother is drinking more than usual. Listeners who aren't familiar with Evanovich's cast of characters may find this adaptation a little hard to follow at first. However, the recitation-complete with a dead-on old lady voice for Grandma and squeals from the elves-is so vivid that listeners will soon recognize the different voices and characters. While I normally like Stephanie Plum novels, this is not up to the standards of the others I have read. Perhaps it is the supernatural involvement of this book. It was somewhat interesting, but I looked forward to the end so I could start something more to my liking. The new character, Diesel, can appear and disappear at a whim, and the object of the bond chase, Sandy Claws, is not Santa, but is a person of unusual powers, and the evil character, Ring, has trouble controlling his supernatural powers. Only the Christmas ending saves this story.

After weeks of reading detective fiction, literary fiction novels that take themselves too seriously, and some squirmy horror, I was ready for something light, something that was just fun. I thought I had read all the Stephanie Plumb novels, but was pleased to find a few un-numbered Stephanies I hadn't discovered yet. All the goofy characters, all the bizarre events, all the unlikely craziness that drives Mrs. Plumb to swig her Four Roses on the sly came together for a really satisfying read. Smiles, giggles and guffaws guaranteed. Crazy elves, electrified senior citizens, an undercover Santa on the lam and a mysterious blonde hunk reminiscent of the character of Earle in *Amazing Grace*, dash Stephanie's hopes for a normal Christmas, but insure readers with a smile or better on every page. I think I'll tuck another Stephanie Plumb into my reading list before I attempt any of the more self-conscious fiction. This is not literature. And thanks be. Fun first.

At this point, Stephanie wonders if she'll ever get a Christmas tree and her Christmas shopping done!"Visions of Sugar Plums" is a fun, if light read. Most of the old familiar characters are included: Joe Morelli, Stephanie's parents, Grandma Mazur, Valerie and her daughters, and Albert Kloughn. However, fans may be disappointed that there's no Ranger in the book. Lula doesn't appear until near the end of the book, but has some very funny scenes, especially when she "finds" a parking spot at the mall. Diesel adds a bit of fantasy that's a nice touch in a book that takes place in a season that's often filled with fantasy. Everyone, including Stephanie, accepts Diesel's sudden appearance. To me that was the only of-note, especially the way Morelli quickly decides that Diesel isn't a threat to his relationship with Stephanie. I groaned a bit when Stephanie was looking for someone named Sandy Claws at Christmas time since I thought that was overly clever but I changed my mind as the story started rolling along. Sandy Claws and his "elf" helpers added much humor to the book. In fact, the book is full of humorous incidents ranging from a food fight to Stephanie buying a Christmas tree (over and over again), the elves, and, of course, Stephanie's car being blown up. The book is worth reading just for the extremely funny take on the poem "'Twas the Night Before Christmas". While the book is long on humor and a bit short on plot, the resolution of the plot line with Grandma Mazur's stud muffin is quite a surprise and well done."Visions of Sugar Plums" is a light but very funny book to read.

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
