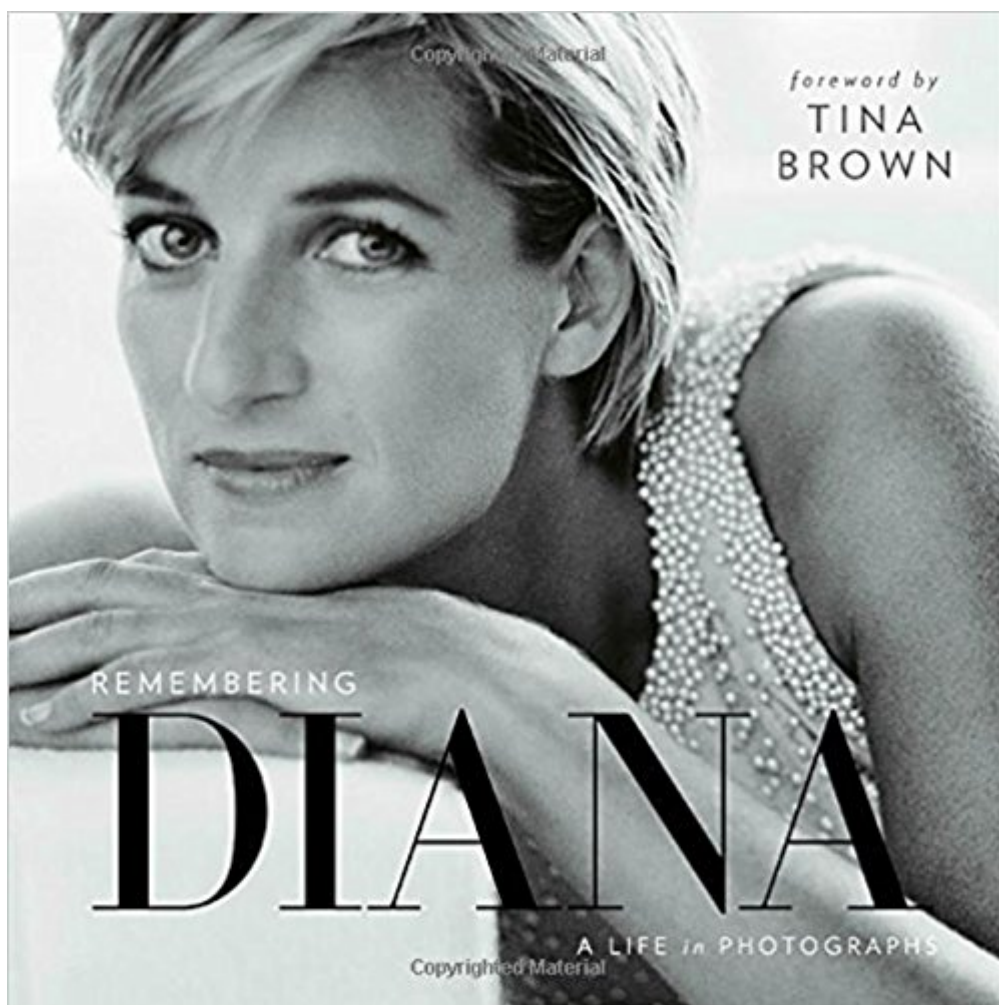


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Remembering Diana: A Life In Photographs

TINA BROWN is an award-winning journalist, editor, author, and founder and CEO of Tina Brown's Live Media, a company dedicated to summits, salons, flash forums, and debates. Between 1979 and 2001, she was editor-in-chief of Tatler, Vanity Fair, The New Yorker and she also authored the 2007 best-selling biography of the Princess of Wales, The Diana Chronicles. In 2000, she was awarded the honor of Commander of the Order of the British Empire by the Queen for her services to journalism. In October 2008 Brown launched and edited the digital news site The Daily Beast, which won the news website of the year award in 2012 and 2013. In 2010 she launched the annual Women in the World Summit that convenes extraordinary leaders such as Meryl Streep, Hillary Clinton, Oprah Winfrey, Angelina Jolie, and Christine Lagarde as well as inspirational activists and political change-makers from all over the world to join the three-day event at Lincoln Center, share their stories, and offer solutions to building a better life for women and girls. In 2014 she launched Tina Brown Live Media to expand Women in the World nationally and launched summits in London and Delhi. The first London Women in the World Summit in 2015 featured participants such as Theresa May, Nicole Kidman, Nobel Laureate Leymah Gbowee, Nicola Sturgeon, Queen Rania of Jordan, Cara Delevingne, and German Minister of Defence Ursula von der Leyen. It generated 515 million Twitter impressions, and an estimated 1.5 billion print, online, and broadcast press impressions. Tina Brown is married to editor, publisher, and historian Sir Harold Evans and lives in New York City.

As the 20th anniversary approaches of the death of Diana, Princess of Wales, TV specials and books are flooding the market. You might think that Tina Brown, with all her experience in publishing, and her acquaintance with Diana, would produce a standout book. But while it's pleasant to leaf through this 200-page book and its 100+ photos, it's no more than that. The photos are familiar ones, the format is on the smaller side for a photography book, and the text is basic. I think most people would be happier checking it out from the library rather than spending hard-earned money on it.

Diana was the most photographed person of her time yet this book is full of the same photos as every other book. If you're a novice Diana collector you'll enjoy this. It's a well put together book. If you like me and a serious Diana collector - skip it you already have all these same tired photos.

This really is a perfect coffee table book - loads of beautiful photos of Diana, mostly of her time as princess. There are early photos and, oddly, photos after her passing that I suppose help to tell a fuller story of her significance to the world. Every photo has a description of either what she was doing, who she was meeting, or what she was wearing in the photograph. It's the kind of book that you can leaf through casually, stop and remember mostly the public parts of her life, and then put down and return to at another time. There's enough about her early and post-Charles life to fill in the gaps but I wouldn't think this book will give you an especially insider's view to her life. It's really a love letter and memorial to a person that was well-loved and is very missed by everyone. I think there's something for everyone, even someone who was not especially focused on Diana during her life will find something to appreciate in this book and will certainly enjoy seeing her journey through these images.

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
