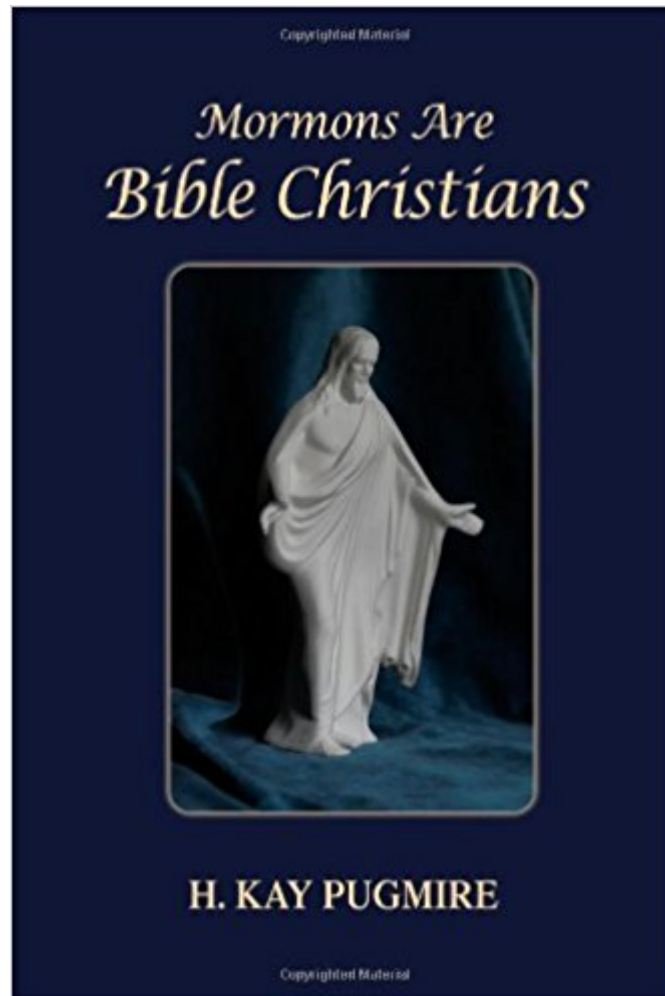

The book is well written and an easy read with a good sprinkling of stories from the author's life and the people he has taught over the past sixty plus years. The first chapter deals with and answers important questions I believe every rational adult has pondered at some time in life. The order of the chapters is well thought out - each chapter draws you into the next " the chapters have a logical and natural flow. Having recently completed the book, I know that I need to read it again and really study it because the knowledge the author shares will help me help those I love most in ways that I could not before. But I wanted to write this review first, before I might be

distracted from doing so. The author obviously understands that the best lessons, like the best buildings, are built on strong foundations; and the best teachers build upon knowledge the students already have and they motivate best using the students' own curiosity. This book explains HOW Mormons are Christians, using the Bible's own verses as the definition for a Christian in the years immediately after Jesus' crucifixion. He carefully details and shows that the beliefs and practices of Mormons today are centered in the teachings of the Bible. His book makes clear not only WHAT Mormons believe, more importantly, it clarifies WHY Mormons believe what they believe through many quoted Bible verses. The author centers his discussions on Jesus Christ and His teachings and he focuses his content on what is most fruitful for the reader's benefit, our individual relationship with Jesus Christ. You will cherish this book and get the most value from it if you are described by ANY of the following: someone searching for the same church that Jesus established on earth before his crucifixion; an open minded Christian searching for clear and simple answers to many of life's most important questions; desiring a better understanding of many prophecies in the Bible concerning the last days; looking for a clear and simple understanding of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, in His time on earth and ours; a Mormon searching for a better way to share the Gospel with those that already believe the Bible; a Mormon missionary called to teach in a region where Catholic or Protestant churches predominate. I am a Mormon and served a mission in Taiwan. I have struggled to share the Gospel with my Christian friends in the years since my mission in a way that they could understand it. I believe this book will be indispensable to any LDS missionary (full time or Stake or Ward) now serving or preparing to serve where the Bible is already in wide use. I recently met the author, by chance while we were both vacationing on the Oregon coast, and I spoke with him briefly on two separate occasions during that vacation. Both conversations were too brief to satisfy me. But that is how I learned of his book and I was left with a deep desire to read the book he described to me as the only book he ever wrote. I was impressed by his demeanor, his constant and easy smile, his fervor to share and his contagious enthusiasm for life, the simple and measured words he used to explain the complex topics we discussed in our conversations, his obvious love and concern for his fellow man, and most importantly, his deep knowledge and mastery of the topics we discussed. He was filled with an apparent passion to share the precious knowledge that he had gained over his eighty plus years in life and it was infectious. He returned home a day after I met him. Later, I returned home and bought a copy of his book on for my Kindle. I read his book for the first time in a single 24 hour period, taking time out to eat and sleep (and nap), and then run some errands, and even to watch a few movies with my wife in that same day (I was still on vacation).

This book is literally an answer to my prayers; I know that after reading it. If you have a Kindle, another tablet, a PC, or a smart phone, and you are still reading this review, I can't think of a better way to spend 99 cents. Even the hard copy is a real bargain, considering what it contains. I wish I had this book years ago. I wish I could write a book as good as this one.

In 1963 I was a young married father of three. I am the Terry in the introduction to *Mormons Are Bible Christians*. My wife, Jan, passed away in 2008. The author gave an overview of where I was at that time in my spiritual quest. What I want to do in this review is to reflect on how the author's approach to my struggles at that time is reflected in the content of this book. In 1963 we had been married for eight years. I was teaching junior high school mathematics in Seattle, Washington. I was also teaching that same age group in the church I had been a member of all my life. I was struggling with my Faith because when my students would ask me questions I could answer them from the Scriptures, but, the problem was that I wasn't sure I believed in my heart what I told them. I knew that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the Living God, and my personal Savior. I felt the Bible was true but there were a lot of question. Many of the same questions I was asked by my students. "Was he really swallowed by a big fish?" "Was He really born of a virgin?" And others. When I spoke to other young marrieds in our church group I was surprised at the lack of concern for the truth of these biblical stories. The response of some of these even suggested that it didn't really matter if Jesus was what He said He was or not. The real lessons of the Scriptures was to be good. Well, I knew that being good was the best way to be happy. I had found out growing up that when I did things bad I wasn't happy. There were consequences. But I didn't need God to tell me that. Why spend all this time and energy if the underlying foundation of the church is not true or doesn't matter. When Jan and I agreed to study with the author the things of the Bible we began a journey that has blessed my life for over 50 years. That first lesson took several hours as I remember it. Kay explained to us the House of Israel. Who they were and why God chose them. We read from the Scriptures. When he explained who the Jews are and who the tribe of Joseph is we began to understand. As Kay was putting this book together he would share chapters with me. As he did so I was impressed with the clarity of his writing. The truths of the Bible were clearly teaching that Jesus Christ is the Jehovah of the Old Testament and He is the Savior of all mankind. Anyone that has questions with regards the truths of the Old and New Testaments need only read this book and another testament of Jesus Christ, the Book of Mormon.

A well written piece on Mormon beliefs and doctrine that should provide a source of answers to many people who labor under a variety of misconceptions about The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. The back of the book has a list of intriguing questions that are answered by the book and serve to challenge a number of misconceptions about the Mormon church that have existed since the church was founded. Well worth your time and at \$0.99 on a kindle or a kindle app on your iPad a great deal.
