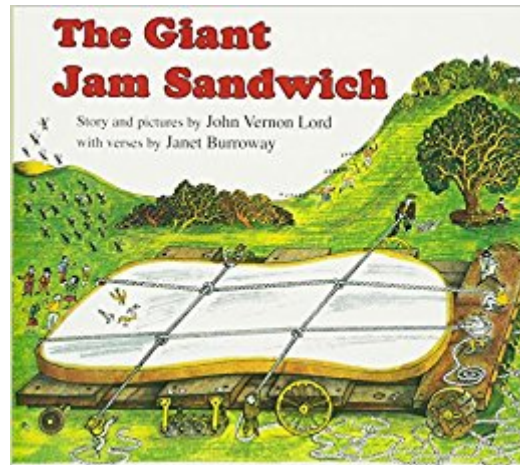

What I like about books like the Giant Jam Sandwich is that they propose these grandiose, funny solutions to problems that I suspect children at first presume to be entirely rational responses in the mysterious world of grown-ups. Enormous loaf of bread, gallons of butter and strawberry jam, tractors modified with helicopter blades? And why not? As Bap's unanimously squeal-approved

proposition states: "What do wasps like best to eat? Strawberry Jam! Now wait a minute..." So the book has everything-- even scientific non-facts. GJS also has going for it a great rhyme and meter without all the Seussian effrontery of meaningless pseudo-words.

This was my favorite book as a child and it caused me great anguish when I couldn't find it in print when my own kids were small. I'm thrilled to have this classic back in my hands, though I wish it weren't presented as a board book. My teens and I enjoyed a spirited reading of The Giant Jam Sandwich and they agreed that it would have been a favorite for them, too. The rollicking rhymes and imaginative illustrations still capture readers' imaginations.
