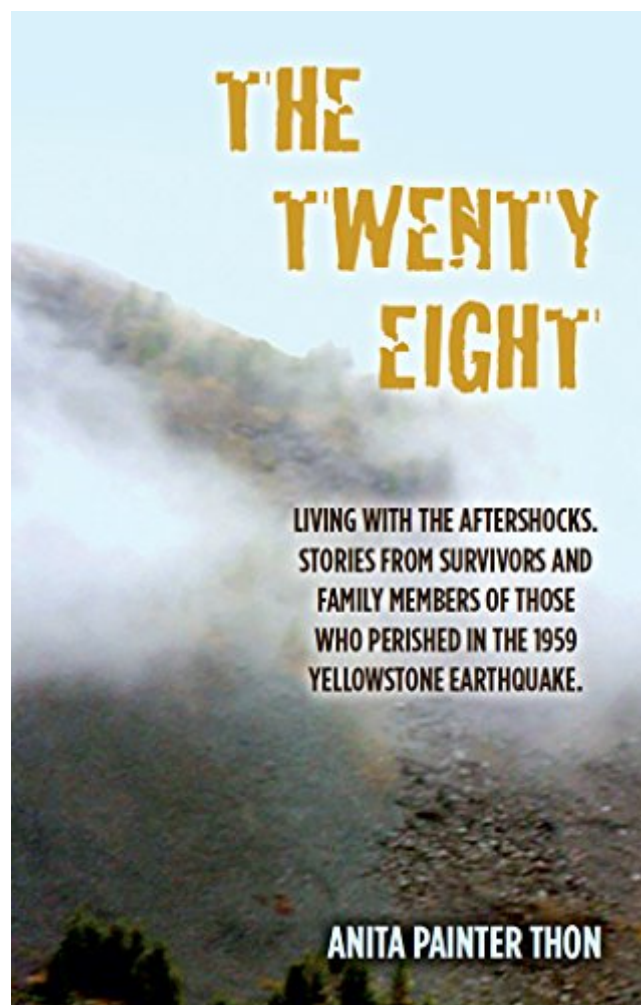

Synopsis

This book is dedicated to the twenty-eight victims of the 1959 Yellowstone earthquake, and their families. Nineteen of those people still lie beneath the 300 foot deep slide. A 7.5 magnitude earthquake shook an 8,000 foot mountain loose, splitting it in half and sending a landslide of dirt, rocks, boulders and pine trees cascading down like a waterfall in the moonlight. The slide crushed cars, tents and trailers in a matter of minutes and it forever changed many lives.

Anita documents a short genealogy of each family, giving a brief account of where the family came from and how they happened to be among the unlucky ones to lose a love one to the quake. Her use of actual newspaper reports and interview notes puts the reader right into the scene of the day the events took place. While reading the various firsthand accounts, I felt as if I was in the room with the person as they relayed what happened to them that night and the days that followed.
